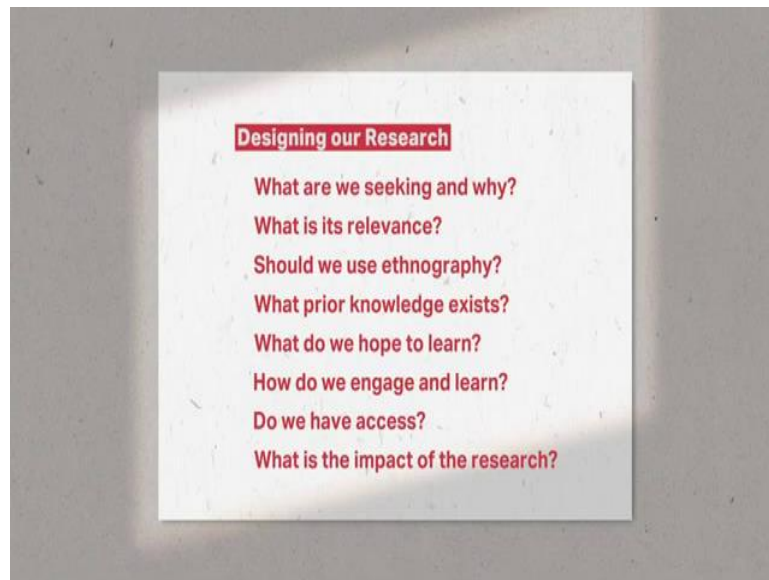

And with this, we wrap up our module on preparing for fieldwork.

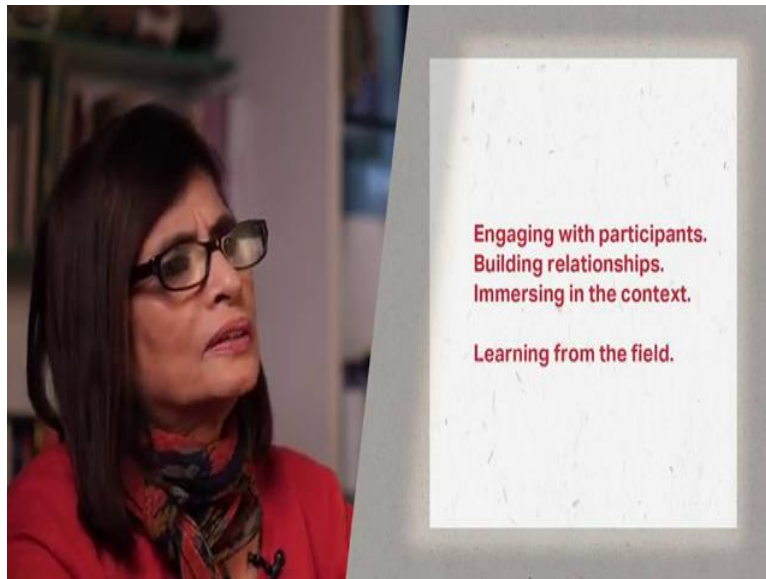
